CART PLACEMENT

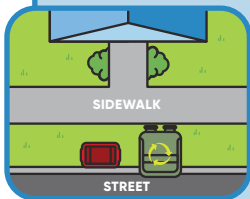
Please leave space around your carts and other objects (as shown below) to improve collection efficiency and help us serve you better.



- Carts must be no more than 3 feet from curb or street with the handle and wheels facing away from street and on a level surface.
- Carts may be placed at curb no earlier than 7:00 p.m. on evening prior to service day. Based on city rule, empty carts must be removed by midnight on day of collection.
- Make sure they are placed on a level surface.
- Be careful not to block bike paths.
- Cart lid must close completely or additional charges may be applied.

Cart Placement Options

Please choose one of these placement options when putting your carts and red glass bin out for pick-up:



On the grass

If there is a level strip of grass between the sidewalk and the street.



On the street, against the curb

If the sidewalk is next to the street. Be careful not to block bike lanes.



In the apron of your driveway

If placement in the street against the curb would block a bike lane.

YARD DEBRIS/FOOD

Yard Debris and Food Waste

Yard debris includes lawn clippings, leaves, pine needles, brush, tree limbs, and plant trimmings.

Food waste includes plate scrapings, meat, bones, dairy products, baked goods, or kitchen trimmings.

Place yard debris and food waste in the gray cart for bi-weekly pick-up on the same day as your regular garbage collection.

Maximum cart weight is 120 lbs. No items outside of the cart will be taken.

Items to avoid

Contaminated yard debris carts will be dumped as garbage and incur a contamination fee. To avoid additional charges, the following items should not be placed in the yard debris cart:



Paper products, compostable serveware such as: plates, cups, bowls, forks, spoons, etc.



Ashes, loose dirt, sod, gravel, rocks, or bricks.



Logs or items larger than:

- Diameter should be 4 in. or less.
- Length should be 3 ft. or less.



Lumber, stumps, root wads, or poisonous vegetation.



Plastic bags, metal, rubber, or garbage; or toxic liquids (motor oil, solvents, paint, etc.)



Pet waste.
