### CART PLACEMENT

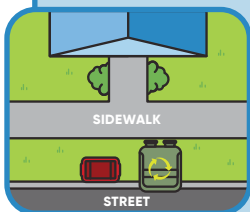
Please leave space around your carts and other objects (as shown below) to improve collection efficiency and help us serve you better.



- Carts must be no more than 3 feet from curb or street with the handle and wheels facing away from street.
- Place carts and bin at the curb by 6:00 a.m. on service day and remove them once they have been emptied.
- Make sure they are placed on a level surface.
- Be careful not to block bike paths.
- Cart lid must close completely or additional charges may be applied.

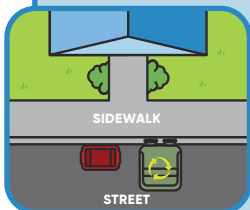
#### Cart Placement Options

Please choose one of these placement options when putting your carts and red glass bin out for pick-up:



#### On the grass

If there's a level strip of grass between the sidewalk and the street.



#### On the street, against the curb

If the sidewalk is next to the street.



#### In the apron of your driveway

If placement in the street against the curb would block a bike lane.

### YARD DEBRIS

#### If it grows, it goes!

Yard debris is defined as lawn clippings, leaves, pine needles, brush, tree limbs, and plant trimmings.

Place yard debris in the gray cart for bi-weekly pick-up on the same day as your regular garbage collection. Refer to the back of this notice for the collection schedule.

No items outside of the cart will be taken.

#### Items to avoid

Contaminated yard debris carts will be dumped as garbage and incur a contamination fee. To avoid additional charges, the following items should not be placed in the yard debris cart:



Ashes, loose dirt, sod, gravel, rocks, or bricks.



Logs or items that exceed dimension guidelines.

- Diameter should be 4 in. or less.
- Length should be 3 ft. or less.
- Max cart weight is 120 lbs.



Lumber, stumps, root wads, or poisonous vegetation.



Liquids (motor oil, solvents, paint, etc.)



Plastic bags, metal, rubber, or garbage.



Kitchen scraps or pet waste.
